

	MJ discussed how the SPF Events Fund helped the events last year. MJ updated the board on the council plans for funding in the next year following the SPF. The board asked if the budget would cover the events for 2025 – MJ and JE to do an extensive budget for the next year.	MJ and JE to do annual budget.

The board agreed with the logic and agreed to look at the full timeline with an aim to set these dates.
